D. William Mooté, University of Western Ontario

Dr. Mooté was born in Toronto, Ontario, Canada, and received his early education in that city, and in Windsor, Ontario. He graduated from the Faculty of Medicine, at the University of Western Ontario in 1979, and earned his certification in Clinical Immunology & Allergy in 1983 at the University of Western Ontario, and fellowship in the Royal College of Physicians & Surgeons of Canada in 1984 in Internal Medicine.

He has specialized in Clinical Immunology & Allergy in London, Ontario since 1984, and served as the division chief from 1992–2002. He is currently Associate Professor of Medicine at the University of Western Ontario.

The division operates an active postgraduate education program that trains physicians interested in a clinical practice or research career in Clinical Immunology & Allergy. He has been the training program director since 1992–2019.

Dr. Mooté is a past-president of the Canadian Society of Allergy & Clinical Immunology, having served on the Board of Directors from 1985 to 1998, and as president in 1992–1994.

Dr. Mooté continues to conduct clinical trials in the treatment of asthma and rhinitis and other allergy problems at London Health Sciences Centre, and is the author of more than forty papers and book chapters on these topics.

He has received several awards for Education, including the David McCourtie award in 2008 and the John Howard Toogood award in 2017.
